MINUTES OF THE THIRD ANNUAL CONVENTION  
OF THE DIOCESE OF HAWAII

Friday, October 8, 1971  
Saturday, October 9, 1971

Assembled in St. Andrew's Priory School gymnasium on the eighth day of October, 1971, the Third Annual Convention of the Diocese of Hawaii was called to order at 8:10 p.m. by the Bishop of Hawaii, the Rt. Rev. E. Lani Hanchett.

A quorum was declared present. The Bishop presented the following tellers, who were duly approved by Convention:

The Rev. Malcolm E. Turnbull was elected Secretary of Convention. The Rev. Guy H. Piltz was appointed as Assistant Secretary by the Rev. Mr. Turnbull, which appointment was duly approved by Convention.

It was moved and duly carried that the courtesy of the floor be extended to the following:

Mr. August Markham of Good Shepherd, Maui, made a motion that next year's Convention be held at the Royal Lahaina Hotel on Maui. The Maui delegation distributed packets on Convention plans, and the delegates were asked to look them over that evening so that it might be brought to a vote on the next day of Convention, October 9, 1971.

The Bishop nominated Mr. Henry F. Budd as Diocesan Treasurer and Mr. James H. Tabor as Chancellor. The delegates voted unanimous approval.

The Bishop asked for the appointment of Burnham H. Greeley as Vice Chancellor of the Diocese. The appointment was approved by Convention.

Prior to the presentation of resolutions, a motion was made by the Rev. Charles T. Crane and carried by more than two-thirds of the Convention, that motions to table or amend resolutions not be entertained until after at least ten minutes of debate.

The Chairman of the Resolutions Committee, the Rev. Malcolm Turnbull, presented the following resolution:

Resolution to Combine the Functions of the Board of Directors and Diocesan Council was passed with a vote by orders as follows:

Lay	117 for	34 against
Clergy	29 for	18 against

At this time Convention came to the end of the agenda. It was the will of Convention that they proceed with the elections. The agenda was so amended. The nominations were to be made at this time, the ballots prepared and elections would take place the following day, October 9.

Discussion ensued on youth being admitted to the Board of Directors. A motion was called to submit this issue to the Constitution and Canons Committee under the direction of Horace Greeley. This was carried by Convention.

The Ven. Richard E. Winkler requested that if a youth be nominated for any position to be voted on by Convention, that it be so specified on the ballot. This was done.

Convention was asked that nominations for the Board of Directors include the nominations from the Council and the old Board of Directors as prepared by the Nominating Committee. This was agreed to by Convention.

It was announced that there would be an outdoor celebration of the

Holy Eucharist in the courtyard by the Cathedral following adjournment. All were invited to attend.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:45 p.m.

The meeting was called to order on October 9, 1971 at 9:30 a.m. At this time the tellers distributed the ballots for election.

RADM Henry Persons, USN (Ret.) of St. Andrew's Cathedral made a motion that, in the event that a person be elected to both the Board of Directors and the Standing Committee, he be offered the choice of giving up one of these offices and that the next person in the order of votes be elected in his place. This was carried by Convention.

Convention was informed that voting for the Board would be by plurality vote and for the Standing Committee by majority vote.

Judge Richard "Ike" Sutton and the Ven. John Y. F. Liu were elected to the Ecclesiastical Court. The Hon. Chief Justice William S. Richardson and the Rev. John P. Engelcke were elected to the Ecclesiastical Court of Appeals. The Rev. Jacinto B. Tabili will fill the unexpired term of the Rev. J. Irwin McKinney.

Mr. Henry F. Budd, Treasurer, reported that his complete report would be mailed at year end with the minutes of Convention.

The Rev. Charles T. Crane made the budget presentation. The budget for 1972 was adopted as distributed, dated September 17, 1971.

The Chairman of the Resolutions Committee, the Rev. Malcolm E. Turnbull, presented the following resolutions:

1. Resolution on the Treasurer of the Diocese serving as Treasurer of the Board was passed by majority vote.
2. The Resolution on the Organization of Convention required a two-thirds vote of each order voting separately. It was carried unanimously by both lay and clergy.
3. The Resolution on Business to Come Before Convention was carried as amended by unanimous vote of each order voting separately.
4. Resolution to Eliminate Reference to the Diocesan Council was carried unanimously by each order voting separately.

At this time the Rev. H. Richard Myers moved that Convention allow debate for fifteen minutes before any action be taken on the subject of a Commission on Ministry. It was carried.

5. Resolution to Establish a Commission on Ministry was carried by a vote by orders.

7. Resolution on the Ordination of Women was carried as amended by the Hawaii Episcopal Youth, the originators of the resolution. It was carried by the necessary majority on a vote of 119 for and 81 against.
8. Resolution on Diocesan Statement on Counseling and Refuge was tabled after lengthy discussion.

The Rev. Howard B. Kishpaugh was elected to the Standing Committee. A majority vote was not received for any of the lay delegates; therefore the Convention had to reballot.

At this time the Resolution to Provide for Election by Plurality Rule was presented and carried by Convention. George Yuen tendered his resignation to the Standing Committee and accepted his position as member of the Board of Directors. This left an unexpired term on the Standing Committee. The Convention voted that the person receiving the second highest vote would take over the unexpired term

of Mr. Yuen. In the revoting, those elected to the Standing Committee to serve with the Rev. Howard Kishpaugh were Mary Ann Du Teil and Richard Decker (filling the unexpired term of Mr. Yuen).

10. The Resolution on District Deans as Members of Convention was passed by two-thirds of each order voting separately. The Bishop concurred.
11. The Resolution on Members of Convention was passed.
12. The Resolution to Hold 1972 Convention on Maui was carried by a vote of 126 to 69.

It was moved and duly carried that the minutes of the Convention be prepared.

The Ven. Paul M. Wheeler made a motion that this Third Annual Convention of the Diocese of Hawaii express appreciation to the Rev. Canon Herbert Conley and the clergy of St. Andrew's Cathedral; the Rev. Fred G. Minuth and staff of St. Andrew's Priory for their assistance and the use of their respective facilities during this Convention.

He further moved that this Convention express its appreciation to Margaret Aaron, Nancy Kuhn, Nancy Hokama, Ruby Nakamura and Alice Mamiya for their assistance in preparing the vast amount of paper work needed by this Convention.

He moved that this Convention express its appreciation to Miss Genevieve Wheeler of St. Peter's Parish for her invaluable service in recording the minutes of this Convention.

He moved that this Convention express its appreciation to the Women of St. Andrew's Cathedral and St. Clement's Parish, who prepared the breakfast.

He moved that Convention give a standing ovation to the Rev. Kenneth D. Perkins who has given many years of faithful service to the Conventions of the Diocese of Hawaii as the Secretary of Convention.

He further moved that this Convention send greetings to Bishop and Mrs. Harry S. Kennedy, the Rev. and Mrs. J. Irwin McKinney, and to Miss Katherine Morton.

Archdeacon Wheeler's motions were carried by Convention.

Noonday prayers were offered by the Rev. Franklin S. H. Chun.

The following resolution, offered by the Rev. J. Hollis Maxson, was

carried by Convention: "It is the wish of this Convention that Bishop Kennedy be offered all of the niceties, perquisites and recognition that he can be given under the Canons."

The Bishop gave his blessing and the Convention was adjourned at 1:52 p.m.

RESOLUTIONS AS PRESENTED AT THIRD CONVENTION

RESOLUTION I

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, Canon XIX of the Diocese of Hawaii provides for the establishment of a Diocesan Council charged with the development, prosecution and review of the program and mission of the Diocese and with general supervision of the financial affairs of the Diocese, and

WHEREAS, Article IV of the Charter of Incorporation of the Church and Articles II and III of the By-Laws of the Church provide for a Board of Directors authorized to administer all of the property, money and funds of the Church and exercise the corporate powers of the Church, and

WHEREAS, a duplication of effort and responsibility has arisen by virtue of the above provisions, resulting in confusion and uncertainty which would be eliminated by combining the two separate entities into one,

IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY RESOLVED, as follows:

1. That the Canons of the Diocese of Hawaii be amended to delete Canon XIX in its entirety.
2. That the succeeding Canons be renumbered accordingly.
3. That the present Canon XVI, Section 1, be amended to delete the reference to the Diocesan Council therein.
4. That the present Canon XX be amended to delete the reference to the Diocesan Council in Section 2 thereof, and substitute in lieu thereof the Board of Directors.
5. That Article I of the By-Laws of the Episcopal Church in Hawaii be amended to delete the reference to the Diocesan Council in the second sentence thereof.
6. That the fourth sentence of Article I of the By-Laws of the Episcopal Church in Hawaii be amended to read as follows:

The Board of Directors of that corporation known as "The Episcopal Church in Hawaii" shall consist of eighteen members, in addition to the Bishop or Coadjutor Bishop, of whom four shall be clerical members and fourteen lay members and who shall be elected annually by the Convention of the Church by the plurality rule. In the event that the directors elected do not include any directors from each of the counties of Kauai, Hawaii and Maui, an additional director shall be elected for each of said counties not otherwise represented. Nominations for such additional directors shall be restricted to clerical or lay members of the Episcopal Church who are residents of the county in question.

7. That Article II of the By-Laws of the Episcopal Church in Hawaii shall be amended by adding the following provision thereto:

The Board of Directors shall establish two standing committees for program and finance. The chairman of such committees shall be members of the Board of Directors and the members thereof shall be chosen to represent the various regions and church program interests.

8. That Article III of the By-Laws of the Episcopal Church in Hawaii shall be amended by adding the following provision thereto prior to the last sentence of said article:

The Directors shall also have charge of the development, prosecution, and review of the program and mission of the Diocese, shall be responsible for the initiation and development of new work between Conventions, and for all other functions heretofore the function of the Diocesan Council.

#### RESOLUTION II

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, at the present time there are conflicting statements in the Constitution and in the bylaws regarding the election of a Treasurer to handle the funds of the Diocese. In the past the Treasurer of the Diocese, elected by Convention, has also been elected Treasurer by the Board of Directors. This is the only workable way since the duties assigned are essentially the same.

WHEREAS, the proposal made in the resolution requires that this be the case. It is a simple change that can possibly prevent serious friction in the future. The pertinent sections of the Constitution, etc. are as follows:

- 1) Section 1, Article X and Article XIII of the Constitution
- 2) Sections 1 and 3, Canon XVIII and Section 4, Canon XIX
- 3) Articles IV and V of the Charter of Incorporation
- 4) Articles II, III and VI of the Bylaws

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Article II of the Bylaws of the Episcopal Church in Hawaii be amended to read, in part:

At a time and place appointed by the President, the Directors shall meet and organize by the election of a Secretary, who must be a Director. The Treasurer of the Diocese shall serve as Treasurer of the Board.

#### RESOLUTION III

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, this resolution serves only to clarify certain portions of the Constitution and Canons. Article VIII provides for the presiding officer at Convention and Article XI provides for the determination of a quorum and voting procedures,

BE IT RESOLVED THEREFORE that Section 1, Article VI of the Constitution be amended to read in part:

"...and such Special Convention shall be organized in the manner prescribed in Articles VIII and XI of this Constitution."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Section 1, Canon IV be amended to read in part:

"...the Convention shall be organized as provided by Articles VIII and XI of the Constitution."

#### RESOLUTION IV

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, this resolution serves only to clarify certain portions of the Constitution. It does, in addition, require what is now normal practice, that is, notification of delegates of the business expected to come before Convention. It does not mean that other business cannot come before Convention.

WHEREAS, Article XX of the Constitution of the Diocese and Canon XXIV of the Canons of the Diocese refer to "the circular letter provided for in Section 2, Article V.," and

WHEREAS, Section 2, Article V, however, makes no mention of a "circular letter" except when time and/or place of annual Convention is changed.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Section 2, Article V of the Constitution be changed to Section 3, Article V, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that new Section 2, Article V shall be:

Every clergyman entitled to a seat, lay delegates and every congregation entitled to representation in the Convention for whom delegates are not known shall be notified by a circular letter, at least 30 days previous to the time appointed. This letter shall specify the business to come before Convention. All matters having to do with amendment to the Constitution or Canons shall be mailed to delegates at least 30 days prior to Convention.



RESOLUTION V

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, District Deaneries were established by resolution of the Diocesan Council on April 12, 1970, on a provisional basis, pending formal action by the Convention of the Diocese of Hawaii, and

WHEREAS, the Diocesan Convention at its annual meeting in October, 1970, approved the continuation of District Deaneries for one year on a provisional basis pending formal action by the 1971 Convention of the Diocese of Hawaii, and

WHEREAS, District Deaneries serve a valuable function as a vehicle for communication between parishes and missions within the various Deaneries as well as providing a vital source of communication between member churches and the administration of the Diocese of Hawaii, and

WHEREAS, District Deaneries have provided, and are providing, an effective means of obtaining more meaningful and fruitful lay involvement in the affairs of the Church, thus further democratizing the Church,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that District Deaneries, as established by the Diocesan Council and subsequently provisionally approved by the Diocesan Convention of 1970, shall be made an institution of the Diocese of Hawaii subject to utilization by the designated geographical deanery areas and also further subject to future action by subsequent Diocesan Conventions, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an increased effort shall be made to increase the scope, activity and effectiveness of District Deaneries so as to enhance their role as a democratic institution within the Church, and in particular in those areas where the District Deanery concept has failed to take firm root.

RESOLUTION VI

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, by resolution of this Convention, the function of the Board of Directors and Diocesan Council have been combined and are to be performed by the Board of Directors, and

WHEREAS, minor references to the Diocesan Council remain in the Constitution of the Diocese of Hawaii,

IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY RESOLVED, as follows:

1. That the reference to the Diocesan Council in Article X, Section 2 of the Constitution be deleted and the Board of Directors substituted therefor so that said section shall read as follows:

Section 2. In case of the death of the Treasurer, or of his inability to act, the Board of Directors shall appoint a Treasurer upon nomination of the Bishop.

2. That the reference to Diocesan Council contained in Article XII, Section 8, of the Constitution be deleted.
3. That the reference to the Diocesan Council contained in the last sentence of Article XIV of the Constitution be deleted and the Board of Directors substituted therefor so that said sentence shall read as follows:

In case of the death of the Registrar, or of his inability to act, the Board of Directors shall appoint a Registrar upon nomination of the Bishop.

RESOLUTION VII

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, this Convention has met for the purpose of electing members of the Church to serve in a number of positions within the Church, and

WHEREAS, adoption of the plurality rule in these elections would greatly simplify and expedite the selection of these persons,

IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY RESOLVED that for the purposes of this Convention all balloting shall be conducted in accordance with the plurality rule and the candidates or nominees for the position or office in question, up to the number required, who receive the highest number of votes shall be declared elected.

RESOLUTION VIII

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, the General Convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church, United States of America, has canonically required the creation of a Commission on Ministry in every Diocese or Missionary District (Title III, Canon I),

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Third Annual Convention of the Episcopal Church in Hawaii repeals the existing Canon V (of a Board of Examining Chaplains) and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following Canon V be adopted for insertion in the Canons of the Episcopal Church in Hawaii:

Section I

There shall be a Commission on Ministry consisting of clergymen and lay persons canonically resident in this Diocese, not less than

seven or more than fifteen members, annually appointed by the Bishop and confirmed by the Annual Convention. Their term of office shall be for one year or until their successors are duly appointed and confirmed. Should a vacancy occur between Conventions, it may be filled by appointment of the Bishop and confirmed by the Standing Committee until the next meeting of the Convention.

Section 2

The Commission on Ministry may adopt rules for its work, subject to the approval of the Bishop, provided the same are not inconsistent with the Canons of the General Convention and the Diocese.

Section 3

The Commission on Ministry shall assist the Bishop in matters pertaining to the enlistment and selection of persons for Ministry; in the guidance and pastoral care of all Postulants, Candidates for Holy Orders, Deacons, Deaconesses, if there be such, and Professional Church Workers; and shall assist the Bishop in matters pertaining to the continuing education of the Ministry.

Section 4

In the presence of the Bishop, and under his guidance and oversight, the Commission on Ministry shall interview each Candidate before his ordination, alike to the Diaconate and the Priesthood, or ascertain his personal readiness for such ordination.

Section 5

The Commission on Ministry shall report in writing and without delay the findings of this interview to the Bishop and the Standing Committee or Council of Advice.

Section 6

In those cases where the conduct and evaluation of the examination of persons for Holy Orders is assigned to the Commission on Ministry, the said Commission shall make the Report called for under Title III, Canon 7 (National Canons), and shall transmit a copy of said Report to the General Board of Examining Chaplains

RESOLUTION IX

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, the change from a missionary district to a diocese has resulted in an increased number of committees and elective offices, and

WHEREAS, the Diocese of Hawaii is still using primitive methods of election not satisfactory for the increased number of delegates, and

WHEREAS, long established dioceses in the Church have streamlined their methods of election to a highly efficient degree,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Committee on Nominations and Elections be empowered to make a study of methods used by older and more experienced dioceses, and to recommend necessary changes to streamline procedures in time for the 1972 Diocesan Convention.

RESOLUTION X

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, at the present time there are conflicting statements in the Constitution and in the bylaws regarding the election of a Treasurer to handle the funds of the Diocese. In the past the Treasurer of the Diocese, elected by Convention, has also been elected Treasurer by the Board of Directors. This is the only workable way since the duties assigned are essentially the same.

WHEREAS, the proposal made in the resolution requires that this be the case. It is a simple change that can possibly prevent serious friction in the future. The pertinent sections of the Constitution, etc. are as follows:

- 1) Section 1, Article X and Article XIII of the Constitution
- 2) Sections 1 and 3, Canon XVIII and Section 4, Canon XIX
- 3) Articles IV and V of the Charter of Incorporation
- 4) Articles II, III and VI of the Bylaws

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Article II of the Bylaws of the Episcopal Church in Hawaii be amended to read, in part:

At a time and place appointed by the President, the Directors shall meet and organize by the election of a Secretary, who must be a Director. The Treasurer of the Diocese shall serve as Treasurer of the Board.

RESOLUTION XI

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, the Women of the Church at the Triennial in Houston October 1970, voted 5 to 1 in favor of the ordination of women deacons, priests and the ordination and consecration of women bishops, and

WHEREAS, the House of Bishops at the 63rd General Convention of the Church meeting in Houston October 1970, overwhelmingly voted in favor of the ordination of women deacons, and

WHEREAS, a majority of the deputies, both lay and clerical, at the 63rd General Convention of the Church, meeting in Houston October 1970, voted in favor of ordaining women deacons and priests and the ordination and consecration of women bishops, and

WHEREAS, the Hawaii lay deputies voted in favor of the ordination and consecration of women bishops, and the clerical vote was divided,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Hawaii Episcopal Youth support this resolution and urge support for this resolution in the Hawaii Diocesan Convention in October 1971.

RESOLVED that the Diocese of Hawaii memorialize the 64th General Convention that it is in favor of the ordination of women priests and the ordination and consecration of women bishops.

#### RESOLUTION XII

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, District Deaneries exist by actions of the Diocesan Council and Convention, and

WHEREAS, intra-Diocesan communication is an important function of District Deaneries, and

WHEREAS, the Dean is the appropriate person to bring Deanery communications to Convention, and

WHEREAS, each Dean is not necessarily a member of Convention but should have the right to speak to Convention,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Section I, Article VII of the Constitution of the Diocese of Hawaii be amended by the addition of Paragraph Seven as follows:

The Dean of each District Deanery, if he is not otherwise a member of Convention, shall have seat and every right and privilege of membership in the Convention, except the right to vote.

#### RESOLUTION XIII

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, the President of the Episcopal Church Women, lay members of the Standing Committee and the Board of Directors and lay chairmen of all Diocesan committees are instrumental in carrying out the will of the Convention, are charged with that responsibility and are without a voice in the decisions of the Convention,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the aforementioned be accorded privileges of the floor without vote at this Convention and it is recommended that the same privilege be accorded at the next Convention and each Convention thereafter.

#### RESOLUTION XIV

Action Taken: Passed

WHEREAS, many dedicated Churchmen on the outside islands of the Diocese of Hawaii have never had the opportunity to experience the inspiration and spiritual uplift provided by a Diocesan Convention, and

WHEREAS, there is a great lack of first-hand knowledge by all too many Churchmen of the activities and problems of the Anglican Churches on islands other than the one on which their home parish is located, and

WHEREAS, a greater understanding of the work of ALL Churches in our Diocese will inevitably promote greater unity among all Churchmen, and

WHEREAS, Holy Innocents' Church in Lahaina was the second Anglican Church to be started in the Kingdom of Hawaii, in 1862, and

WHEREAS, our beloved Bishop began his ministry as a parish priest at Holy Innocents' Church, and

WHEREAS, the world-renowned Kaanapali resort area in Lahaina now has ample facilities to accommodate conventions considerably larger than our Diocesan Convention, including hotel rooms, meeting rooms, dining and banquet facilities, and complete secretarial and stenographic services, plus a wide range of cultural and recreational attractions unequalled anywhere else in the State for those who may wish to spend some time on Maui before or after such a Convention,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 4th Annual Convention of the Episcopal Church in Hawaii be held at the Royal Lahaina Hotel, Kaanapali Beach, Lahaina, on the island of Maui, October 13 - 15, 1972;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that consideration be given to holding future Diocesan Conventions on an outside island every third year.

(1) Accounts and Records

The accounts and records of the Church do not reflect the financial position and results of operations of parishes, missions or institutions which conduct the activities of The Episcopal Church throughout the State of Hawaii. However, certain trusts of these departments are held by the Church, and accordingly, have been taken into account in the accompanying balance sheet.

(2) Land and Buildings

Title to all real property (other than real property of St. Clement's Church) is vested in The Episcopal Church in Hawaii; accordingly, such property is accounted for in the records of the Church. The carrying value of the property is frequently an estimated amount not readily subject to accurate determination, intended to represent expenditures made not only by the Church but also by missions, parishes or other persons.
