Retired Clergy and Families honor Black History Month at the Honolulu Museum of Art (HoMA) on February 7th



The Oahu members of the Retired Clergy and Bishop +Bob Fitzpatrick and Bea Fitzpatrick enjoyed a luncheon at the HoMA Cafe followed by a presentation by The Rev. Dcn. Robert Steele to honor and learn more about Black artists at the Honolulu Museum of Art. Black History Month is from February 1st to March 1st and our own Robert Steele, deacon at Holy Nativity and his wife Jean have donated a part of their collection of African American art to the Museum.

The first paragraph of the text behind Robert and Jean reads:

"Forward together celebrates the Honolulu Museum of Art's transformative acquisition of 55 prints from the Jean and Robert Steele Collection. Organized in two rotations of 25 print's each, the exhibition examines some of the ways in which African American artists and black owned and operated workshops shaped the development of printmaking to influence 20thcentury American art and visual culture. Dr. Steele is the former director of the David C. Driskell Center for the study of the visual Arts of African Americans and the African Diaspora in the University of Maryland. Now residing in Hawai'i, he and his wife Jean have been collecting prints and works on paper by African American artists since the 1960s. Over the decades they befriended many of the artists and printmakers whose works are on display."

On this occasion, both Robert and his wife Jean talked about the many prints exhibited there. For those of you who missed it, we hope that you have an opportunity to visit HOMA and see the exhibit.

I was ordained to the priesthood at Holy Innocents on April 22, 1981. It was at a time of transition with the departure of rector, Charley Burger.

Bishop Browning asked me if I would take responsibility for the worship at Holy Innocents and so starting in May, I was serving Holy Innocents Episcopal Church, Lahaina.

One day in June 1981, when I was in the office, a tall Filipino/Hawaiian woman came into the office and said, "I want one baptismal for my nephew." I then asked her about her connection to Holy Innocents. She said, "I am in the picture". I had to hear this twice, and as she spoke, she pointed to the sanctuary of the church. Then I looked at her face and I finally understood what she was saying. **She was the model for the baby Jesus in the painting on the wall behind the altar.**

I then took her into the church and took her picture in front of the painting. I am amazed at how she still had the same look as the baby in the painting.

David Gierlach, Rector, St. Elizabeth's, Honolulu

David was called in 2010.Under Fr. David's leadership, St. Elizabeth's has four ethnic choirs that add joy to the Sunday Mass, in addition to our wonderful Bell Choir and children's choir, (musical director Ajaon Chen), hosts the Catholic Worker though Wallyhouse, providing many services for those in need in our community, including a daily food pantry, delicious Saturday breakfasts and Tuesday hot lunches, Laundry services for the houseless; a community peace garden with aqua and hydroponics and is actively involved in social justice organizations and causes. *From St. Elizabeth's website*.

Bruce DeGooyer, Vicar, Holy Innocent's, Maui *Bishop Fitzpatrick wrote:*

Today was the first day of Bruce's retirement. Good Shepherd's Rector, Moki Hino, invited me to preach and Bruce to celebrate the Eucharist. I was able to bless new stoles and an alb for Bruce to replace some of his vestments lost in the Lahaina fire.

Bruce had come out of retirement to serve as Vicar of Holy Innocent's. He had decided to retire before the Maui fire occurred and retired at the end of September 2023.



Raymond Woo, Vicar, St. Luke's, Honolulu,

retired as of January 1, 2024. Father Ray and his wife Viv will be moving to Penang, Malaysia, at the end of the year to be closer to their family in Singapore.

Father Ray has over 40 years of dedicated service in a variety of settings, most recently as the Vicar at St. Luke's for the past eight years. He has served on a number of Diocesan ministries, including the Commission on Ministry (COM), Standing Committee, and as a teacher for two graduating classes of the Waiolaihui'ia Center for Ministry (WCM), the Diocese's formation program. *From Chronicle, July 23, 2023*

CHRISTINE "TEENA" URBAN

Christine "Teena" Urban passed away on October 2, 2023, at her home at the Ivy at Hawaii Kai, after many months of decline from congestive heart failure and COPD. She was born and raised in Chicago, Illinois. She moved to Honolulu, Hawaii when she was 28 years old. She never left. She loved Hawaii and made it her home, visiting the mainland only to see her mother and sisters annually. Teena completed her Bachelor of Science at University of Hawaii shortly after arriving in Honolulu and began a teaching career in special education at Radford High. Later she entered the field of education administration. She was Vice Principal at Castle High School from 1987-1991; she was Principal at Keolu Elementary School from 1991 until her retirement in 2000.

Teena married the Rev. Darrow L. K. Aiona, who preceded her in death in 2012. Their 41-year union was accentuated by a common faith as well as by years of foreign travel together, which they both enjoyed immensely. After Darrow's death, Teena volunteered regularly, until her death, at St. Mark's Episcopal Church where Darrow had been Rector. In 1970, David was appointed Headmaster of 'Iolani School and remained in that position until his retirement in 1992. After his retirement in 1992, Rev. Coon became the substitute minister in various parishes on the Big Island, traveling between Ocean View and Kapa'au. In 1998, Rev. Coon became an interim trustee for Kamehameha Schools, where he served for two years. He continued his service to the community, serving on various boards, including Parker School, the North Hawaii Community Hospital, and fundraising for various causes.
