


## THE 5th ANNUAL DIOCESAN CONVENTION

St. Andrew's Cathedral and St. Andrew's Priory School, Honolulu October 26-28, 1973

This was the Cross used for the 59th General Convention of the Episcopal Church when it met in Honolulu in September 1955. The Hawaiian words, "He Lanakila Ma Ke Kea," symbolize the cross and crown, and mean "Victory through Suffering" or "Victory through the Cross." This motto was adopted by the first Anglican Bishop for the Church in Hawaii, The Rt. Rev. Thomas N. Staley.

A miniature silver cross is given by the Bishop, for Distinguished service in the Diocese of Hawaii.

#### MINUTES of the 5th Convention

#### FRIDAY, OCTOBER 26, 1973

The Fifth Annual Convention of the Diocese of Hawaii opened with the Holy Eucharist (Services for Trial Use, First Service) in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Honolulu, Hawaii, at 7:00 p.m., on the 26th day of October, 1973. There followed the Preparation and Proclamation of the Word of God. This was in keeping with the decision to hold this Convention within the context of the Eucharist. The Rt. Rev. E. Lani Hanchett, Bishop of Hawaii, at this time, gave his annual address.

The Convention was called to order in St. Andrew's Priory School's Gymnasium at 7:51~p.m. by Bishop Hanchett.

The Rev. Franklin S.H. Chun was declared Secretary Pro-Tem of Convention.

A quorum was declared present with  $47\ \text{clergy}$  and  $155\ \text{authorized}$  lay delegates present.

The Rev. David K. Kennedy, Chairman of the Committee on Nominations and Elections, presented the slates for Diocesan Treasurer, Diocesan Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, Secretary of Convention, Assistant Secretary of Convention, and Registrar. There being no nominations from the floor for any of these offices, a motion was made and seconded that these nominees be declared elected by acclamation. The motion carried. (see Attachment I-A, "ELECTIONS")

At this time, the Rev. Mr. Kennedy moved a change in the agenda, asking that the elections for all offices be held this evening, and further that if there are run-off elections that they be held the next morning. The motion carried.

The Bishop appointed the tellers (see Attachment II - "APPOINTMENTS"), and the elections then followed.

The Bishop acknowledged the presence of Trinity Episcopal Church in Kailua-Kona as an organized mission with voice and vote, and also the representative from the Episcopal Mission Kwajalein, The Rev. William H. Aulenbach.

"The prayers of the Hawaii seminarians at C.D.S.P. will be with you and the delegates at our Fifth Annual Convention. Signed, Bill Grant, Curt Zimmerman, John Filler."

In voting for the Diocesan Standing Committee, the Rev. Donn H. Brown moved that on the first ballot, in order to be elected, a clergyman or layman must receive a majority vote. If there is no layman or clergyman who receives a majority vote, then on the second ballot those receiving the highest number of votes will be elected. The motion carried.

There being no nominations from the floor, the judges for the Ecclesiastical Court and the Ecclesiastical Court of Appeals were elected by acclamation. (See Attachment I-A " $\underline{\text{ELECTIONS}}$ ")

A letter was received from the Rev. W. Edwin Bonsey, Jr., asking that the Directors of the Episcopal Church in Hawaii be elected by "cumulative voting." An explanation of the procedure was given by Mr. James H. Tabor, Chancellor. When using cumulative voting, those that receive a plurality vote are elected. Mr. Tabor also gave an explanation of caucusing, and the delegates were given 15 minutes to caucus after the nominations were closed. He explained further that if after the elections for the Board of Directors, there was not a representative from each of the four major Islands on the Board, then further nominations would be held to have each Island represented. These nominations would be in addition to the four clergy and fourteen lay members elected.

The Rev. Mr. Bonsey, Chairman of the Resolutions Committee, reported that no resolution had been submitted.

The following clergy and their wives were welcomed to the Diocese by the Bishop:

The Rev. Giles L. Asbury and his wife Barbara; The Rev. Alejandro S. Geston and his wife Simeona; The Rev. Barrett K. Lindsey and his wife Eileen; The Rev. David M. Paisley and his wife Kay; The Rev. Peter E. Van Horne and his wife Beverly; and also Mr. Kenneth Smith and his wife Ann.

The Rev. Irwin McKinney and his wife, Grace, were welcomed to Convention on their return-visit to Hawaii.

The Rev. Canon James G. Long moved that the courtesy of the floor be extended to The Rev. & Mrs. Giles L. Asbury, Chaplain & Mrs. Frederick J. Ellis, Jr., Chaplain & Mrs. John W. Fritts, The Rev. & Mrs. Barrett K. Lindsey, The Rev. & Mrs. John T. Moore, Jr., The Rev. & Mrs. Peter E. Van Horne; and that the same privileges be extended to the clergy and delegation from the Church of St. John the Divine, Guam. The motion carried.

The Ven. Jordan B. Peck, Jr., (Guam), thanked the Convention for the privilege of voice at the Convention and introduced the delegates and alternates from St. John the Divine.

At this time the Ven. Mr. Peck read a petition from St. Andrew's of the Philippine Sea (see Attachment III), to the Bishop for his approval, and for endorsement by the Convention. He introduced members of the delegation from St. Andrew's.

The Bishop by the authority given him by the Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church, accepted St. Andrew's of the Philippine Sea as an organized mission of the Episcopal Church. The mission was accepted by acclamation and given a standing ovation of the Convention.

The Rev. Charles T. Crane moved that the Convention meet on Saturday at 9:00 a.m., rather than 8:00 a.m. The motion carried.

The Rev. Thomas K. Yoshida brought love and greetings from the Rev. Howard B. Kishpaugh and his wife, Carol.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:20 p.m.

## SATURDAY, OCTOBER 27, 1973

The meeting was called to order by Bishop Hanchett on October 27th, at 9:00 a.m., and continued with the Holy Eucharist -- Declaration of Faith, Penitential Order and Prayers, and the Litany of Commitment to Christian Service. During prayers, the Rev. Burton L. Linscott read the Necrology (see Attachment IV, "NECROLOGY").

The Bishop asked that Joan Brooks and Elnora Morrett be remembered in our Intercessory Prayers.

At this time, an interim report on election results was given by the Rev. David K. Kennedy. A run-off election was needed to elect the clerical member of the Standing Committee. (see Attachment I-A, "ELECTIONS"). All major Islands had been represented on the Board of Directors. (see Attachment I-B, "ELECTIONS").

The 1974 Budget was presented by Mr. Henry F. Budd, Treasurer.

General Convention adopted two budgets in Louisville.

The General Convention Budget was \$1,855.236. Income for this budget is raised by an assessment of \$53 for each clergyman in each Diocese. We are being assessed for 88 clergy, which Mr. Budd intends to question.

The second budget, which is the National Church Program Budget, is \$13,600,000. This is raised through a new formula based on net disposable income. Our original apportionment was \$54,000, but we pledged only \$32,000. In 1974 we were prepared to go as high as \$40,000. Under the new NDI formula our 1974 quota will be \$36,821, which will mean a net reduction of \$2,365 in these two budget items. For the first time, Hawaii will be paying its full share of the National Church quota. Also for the first time, Hawaii will not be receiving a subsidy from the National Church.

Our local assessments reflect a net increase of \$4,878 over 1973. There is a possibility of some minor adjustments to this figure due to a few appeals to the Finance Committee of the Board. The same mathematical formula was used as in 1973; that is 10% of local receipts, plus an amount indicated on a graduating scale and \$1 per communicant. An additional 2% was added to each assessment upon recommendation of the Finance Committee and approval of the Board of Directors.

St. Andrew's Priory will receive no subsidy from the Diocese in 1974. This is a reduction of \$14,530; The Program Budget was reduced from \$30,000 to \$18,000; Increases in Part I of the budget are due mainly to a 5.5% increase in salaries.

For the year 1973 we adopted a budget with a forecasted deficit of \$12,205. Only \$6,000 has been received thus far to make up that deficit. Mr. Budd hopes that any surplus for 1974 will be used to reduce this deficit.

Mr. Budd moved for adoption of the Budget.

Dr. Moheb Ghali (St. Mary's Church) offered the following amendment to the budget:

WHEREAS the reduction of the Program Budget for 1974 from \$30,000 to \$18,000 is not in accordance with our mission as Christians, and

WHEREAS the Bishop in his opening address expressed his disappointment with such a budget,

THEREFORE, let it be resolved that the 1974 Diocesan budget be amended as follows:

A special assessment in the amount of 1.00 per communicant shall be imposed on the parishes and missions of the Diocese.

The proceeds of this special assessment shall be used exclusively to supplement the proposed Program Budget of \$18,000 for 1974.

The Program Committee shall submit a revised Program Budget to the Board of Directors for approval.

Judge Ike Sutton (Holy Cross) moved to table the amendment. The motion was lost.

The Rev. Claude F. Du Teil (St. Christopher's) felt that the Program Budget was not a Program at all, but instead money spent on ourselves for such things as the Chronicle, Faith at Work, and H.E.Y.

The Rev. Charles T. Crane (Holy Nativity) pointed out that mission, campus ministry, and P.I.C. clergy are also part of Program, so it could be said that \$107,000 was going to Program.

The Rev. Guy H. Piltz (St. James') pointed out that if we take the National Church quota and subtract the \$36,821, it would leave \$3,179 in budgeted dollars. That would produce more in the way of Program income than the surcharge of \$1 per communicant. Mr. Budd pointed out that we also have a \$6,000 deficit to make up.

The Very Rev. Herbert N. Conley (St. Andrew's) and The Rev. Canon James G. Long suggested that raising the assessments to the churches would be a more effective method of raising money for the program than a \$1 surcharge.

The Rev. Rudolph A. Duncan (St. Mary's) suggested that another alternative was a progressive type of assessment where the larger parishes would pay more and the smaller parishes and missions would pay less.

Mr. Leslie Thomas (Holy Nativity) opposed the amendment, because he felt that the majority of church program is carried out by the parishes and not by the Diocese or the National Church.

The Rev. William R. Grosh said that it is not the principle, it is the money. Many people  $\underline{\mathsf{need}}$  that \$1 per communicant.

Convention voted in favor of the amendment to the budget and subsequently voted to approve the budget for 1974 with the amendment.

Convention approved the appointments to the Commission on the Ministry made by Bishop Hanchett (see Attachment II, "APPOINTMENTS").

For other appointments, the Bishop selected only the chairmen and asked that they choose their own committees and give the names to the Bishop for his approval (see also Attachment II, "APPOINTMENTS").

Mrs. Alexander (Lou) Campbell (Holy Innocents') gave a report on the Church Divinity School of the Pacific: She gave greetings from Lynette Golderman. She reported that the school was doing well and that the new Dean, Frederick H. Borsch, was one of the reasons. There are 96 students, 46 new this year. A motion has been passed to buy an apartment building for married student housing, particularly for the first year students. It will cost \$250,000 and a \$180,000 commitment has been received from one person. New programs are being initiated: (1) a field education program with Dr. John L. Bogart; (2) an Experimental Ministry with 4 people from the Order of the Holy Cross; (3) experiments with pyschological testing and evaluation program for career assessment. She reported that income has not kept up with inflation and 62% of their budget is dependent on outside donations. To keep the seminary open, \$365,000 per year is needed. She stressed that chapel services were the center and heart of the seminary with two services a day, one a Eucharist and one Evening Prayer. The students are eager for spiritual growth and development. Mrs. Campbell introduced Paul C. T. Loo (Holy Nativity) as the newest member of the C.D.S.P. Board of Directors.

The Ven. Paul M. Wheeler moved that this Fifth Annual Convention of the Diocese of Hawaii convey a warm Aloha to the Right Rev. John M. Allin, our Presiding Bishop-Elect, and promise our total support. The motion carried.

The Ven. Mr. Wheeler further moved that this Convention send affectionate greetings to Bishop and Mrs. Harry S. Kennedy. The motion carried.

He moved that Convention give a standing ovation to The Rev. Norman Ault for his many years of loving and faithful service in the Lord's vineyard and wish him and Mrs. Ault much happiness in their retirement. The Convention gave a standing ovation.

He moved also that Convention extend congratulations and best wishes to The Rev. Jack Tabili and his bride, Clarita, on their recent marriage. The motion carried.

The Ven. Mr. Wheeler further moved that much thanks go to the staffs of St. Andrew's Cathedral, St. Andrew's Priory School, and St. Peter's Church for their efforts as well as for the use of their facilities. The motion carried.

He moved that Convention express deep gratitude to Miss Genevieve Wheeler for her cheerful acceptance of the responsibility of recording the minutes of this Convention; our Mahalo also to Colonel Jonike Henry, Miss Minnie Reid, Nancy Kuhn, Nancy Hokama, Ruby Nakamura, and Alice Mamiya who worked so hard with the details involving Convention preparation. The motion carried.

Bishop Hanchett expressed Convention's thanks to Suzie Swartman for all her hard work in helping with Convention plans.

It was moved and carried that the reports presented to the delegates in the packets be accepted.

It was moved and carried that the secretary be instructed to prepare the minutes of the Convention.

Word was received during Convention that Mrs. John (Elnora) Morrett passed away. Prayers were offered for her by Convention.

It was moved and carried that a letter be sent to John Morrett and his family expressing our deepest sympathy and affection.

It was moved and carried that Convention offer a resolution of thanksgiving for the leadership of Presiding Bishop John E. Hines.

The Rev. Thomas K. Yoshida reported that when Presiding Bishop-elect John Allin was presented to the House of Deputies the deputation from Hawaii presented Bishop Allin with a red carnation lei on behalf of the Diocese of Hawaii.

It was moved and carried that the Sixth Annual Diocesan Convention be held on October 4, 5 and 6, 1974.

At this time Convention entered into the Great Thanksgiving of the Holy Eucharist during which time Convention offered up to God all that had happened in the course of this Diocesan Convention.

The Eucharist was also offered up in thanksgiving for the life of Elnora Morrett and for intercession for her family.

It was announced that on Sunday, November 4, 1973, an anniversary service would be held at St. Andrew's Cathedral in honor of Bishop S. Harrington Littell and all bishops of Hawaii before and since.

Following the conclusion of the Holy Eucharist Service and Noonday Prayers, the Convention was adjourned at 10:55 a.m.

At the Convention Banquet (an 8-course Chinese dinner), that evening, held at the Ilikai Hotel, Bishop Hanchett presented "the Bishop's Cross for Distinguished Service" to

In the concluding service of Convention, held at St. Andrew's Cathedral, 11:00 a.m., the Holy Eucharist (Services for Trial Use, First Service) was celebrated, and the Rev. John T. Moore Jr., of St. John the Divine, Guam, was ordained to the priesthood.

## THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN MICRONESIA

#### GUAM MISSION

St. Andrew's of the Philippine Sea

October 2, 1973

To The Right Reverend E. Lani Hanchett Bishop in Charge of Micronesia Bishop of Hawaii

A group of Communicants of the Church in the south central area of Guam, near Apra and Agat have sought to establish an Episcopal mission in that area.

A piece of property adjacent to Nimitz Beach, Agat, has been promised for purchase at below market price by one of the Communicants, and the Board of Directors of the Diocese of Hawaii have been approached for approval of the purchase. Loan funds for the construction of a temporary building to house a child day care center which will also serve as a place of worship have been sought from the National Church and local sources.

Worship services have been regularly held by one group of Communicants at a Santa Rita (Apra) private residence and by another at St. John the Divine, Tumen Bay.

The intent of this mission is to serve both the families of western cultural background and the Philippine community; initially this will be accomplished throught two worshiping congregations, holding separate and sometimes joint worship. As the cultural differences and needs diminish, this separation shall naturally disappear.

The name chosen by the two congregations of the mission, St. Andrew's of the Philippine Sea, has received your approval, for which we are grateful. The name recognizes the sponsorship and oversight of the first Episcopal mission on Guam by the then Missionary District of Honolulu and the Canon of St. Andrew's Cathedral who became the first resident priest to Micronesia. It further holds significance recognizing that St. Andrew's Seminary 1 the Philippines has provided a priest to this mission and is training the second postulant for Holy Orders from Juam.

The worship and administration of this mission under your supervision will be conducted by co-vicars, the Reverend Jacinto B. Tabili and the Reverend John T. Moore, Jr.

#### December 31, 1973 and 1972

#### (1) Significant Accounting Policies

#### Accounts and Records

The accounts and records of the Church do not reflect the financial position and results of operations of parishes, missions or institutions which conduct the activities of The Episcopal Church throughout the State of Hawaii. However, certain trusts of these departments are held by the Church and accordingly have been taken into account in the accompanying balance sheets.

#### Land and Buildings

Title to all real property (other than real property of St. Clement's Church) is vested in The Episcopal Church in Hawaii; accordingly, such property is accounted for in the records of the Church. The carrying value of the property is frequently an estimated amount not readily subject to accurate determination, intended to represent expenditures made not only by the Church but also by missions, parishes or other persons.

#### Trust Investments

The Church through its agent, Hawaiian Trust Co., Limited, maintains an investment pool on behalf of itself, parishes and missions. Income, which is distributed quarterly, is recorded when received. Gains or losses from investment transactions are treated as additions to or deductions from principal and accordingly have no effect on income available for distribution.

#### (2) Notes Payable

Notes payable at December 31, 1973 and 1972 are shown below. Interest rates indicated are for 1973; rates for 1972 were, in general, substantially lower.
